

USE A METRONOME


PRACTICE AWAY FROM YOUR INSTRUMENT

School Policy reminders

MISSED LESSONS

Just a friendly reminder that we cannot compensate for missed lessons

In the past we have offered scheduled make-up lessons when a space became available. However this privilege is starting to be expected. Parents need to understand that this policy is in place to support our teachers with consistent pay.

"Lessons or classes <u>cannot</u> be compensated for absences and/or missed lessons that occur because students have conflicts, traveling out of town or illness. <u>This policy is to support the continuation of the music school</u>. If there is a serious, unforeseen circumstance for absence then this is negotiable."

CANCELATION POLICY

"Enrolment is ongoing unless
Making Musicians is notified in
writing (email is sufficient) with a
minimum of 2 weeks notice. If
cancelling mid term a cancellation
fee to the amount of 2 weeks
lessons will need to be paid"

LATE FEE

"Fees must be paid for by <u>Week 2</u> of each term. Failure to do so will result in a 10% late fee."

If there is a problem with your ability to make payment of fees then please speak to the director.

November / December AMEB exam information

Australian Music Examination Board offers graded examinations for a range of musical instruments (including voice) covering classical, popular and contemporary styles and techniques. In general, practical examinations comprise the presentation of work in the following areas: technical work; studies and pieces; aural tests; sight-reading and general knowledge.

Why do an exam?

Setting goals

Having a clearly defined goal can be a powerful motivating force. AMEB syllabuses set educationally appropriate goals, and examinations are an opportunity for students to measure themselves against these goals. Performing in front of others also helps to develop poise and confidence.

Progress through feedback

Examinations are conducted by highly trained examiners who are specialists in their field. Each candidate who completes an AMEB exam receives a personal written report from their examiner. This independent feedback encourages the student to progress by highlighting areas of strength and weakness under performance conditions to help guide students in their development.

Recognising achievement

Each successful AMEB candidate receives an official certificate recognising their achievement. An AMEB certificate is a tangible reminder of a milestone achieved and a source of great pride.

Price

Exam prices range from \$90 - \$147 depending on the level and length of an exam.

Please note the prices for exams are set by the AMEB not by the staff at Making Musicians.

Exams can be scheduled for any date between the 10th November - 8th December. The music school will not be notified of the scheduled date until approximately two weeks prior.

ENTRIES CLOSE 17th SEPTEMBER

Other exam information

Practical examinations are held twice a year: April/May & November/December.

AMEB examinations are held at The Joan Sutherland Centre in Penrith.

A late fee of \$60 per candidate per exam will apply to enrolments received after the closing date.

It is not possible under any circumstances to transfer from one year to the next.
