Pet Care this Holiday Season

While taking in the joy of Christmas, your pets may want to join in the cheer, but this could result in serious health concerns. We have a few tips to help keep your pets safer this Christmas.

Beware of the Holiday Feast

Food is synonymous with the holidays, but any rich food that your pets are not used to can cause nausea, diarrhea, vomiting or more serious conditions like pancreatitis or bloat. Some foods are even fatal. We know of chocolate toxicity, but other foods that are toxic include onions, garlic and leeks (found in stuffing), anything with macadamias, sultanas, raisins and grapes, alcohol or artificial sweetener (Xylito). Specifically for dogs; cooked bones can splinter and cause intestinal blockages.

Beware of the Décor

Other items your pet may chew that will not be able to be digested and are therefore harmful include candy canes, gifts of food that may be under the tree, lights and Mistletoe. Don't forget to keep an eye on cats who like to play with anything that dangles or sways like tinsel and Christmas lights.

Beware of the Noise and Numbers

Cats and dogs can get upset with lots of people coming in and out. Young children may be equally as scared. So make sure your pets have a quiet area of their own surrounded by familiar things, where they can get peace. Fireworks can also be very upsetting for cats and dogs. Make sure you walk dogs early in the day and shut cats in for the night.
