Message from Julian Levy, President

Fifty years ago, just before Rosh Hashanah, the founding residents moved into the Maurice Zeffert Home. And now, after half a century, almost everything is different – the buildings, the number of residents and the modern services the Home provides.

The Government has increased its involvement enormously, requiring volumes of administrative procedures and regular accreditation compliance.

The Maurice Zeffert Home has always employed professionals who will meet these continually changing demands and there are many ongoing procedures to ensure the highest level of care is always maintained. The Federal Government provides certain funding for Residential Aged Care, but as the press has reported recently, these funds are insufficient to operate a high quality Residential Aged Care facility profitably without additional funding from other sources: e.g. fund raising and appeals to the community. Furthermore, we must carry the cost of maintaining strict kashrut without any additional funds from the Government or the residents.

Over the last couple of years our senior staff have taken measures to streamline our resources in order to maximize efficiencies, whilst still maintaining the highest level of care. Whenever a family member expresses a concern regarding care, which may sometimes be a simple misunderstanding, immediate discussion is held with senior management, and agreement is reached on means to overcome that concern. Home encourages residents and their families to share any concerns with senior management to



ensure that the highest standard of care is maintained for all residents. Recently, various Government Authorities have carried out exhaustive checks on our procedures, and I am pleased to be able to report that they confirm that Maurice Zeffert Home residents continue to receive top quality care.

As you all know, we have plans for redeveloping the independent living units. This will replace ageing accommodation with modern apartments, which in turn will provide capital funds to build additional Residential Aged Care capacity. It is

important to note that these funds will also compensate for the deficit that we incur in providing Residential Aged Care. To update the progress report in the last newsletter: our discussions with the City of Stirling have advanced significantly, and by the time of the Annual General Meeting, I hope to be able to announce that we have received planning approval.

I sincerely hope that you will maintain your loyalty and confidence in the Maurice Zeffert Home, and be assured that the welfare of the residents in our Residential Aged Care will always be our first priority.

I wish you and your families a Shana Tova and a healthy and happy New Year.
