Maheno Display

The Vestry now houses a new display related to the TSS Maheno, which was wrecked on Fraser Island in 1935. Many unique items are on view. Included is a casting of the original bell in bronze, created by Old's Engineering of Maryborough. The bellrope was made by our own Master Ropemaker. A model of the Urangan Pier is also on show.
