Creating opportunities through friendship

Our Programs

Family Match Program

Individual volunteers provide long term companionship and flexible respite support to a child or young person and their family.

Live Your Community Program (LYCP)

Individual volunteers provide friendship, practical assistance and mentoring support to a child or young person, helping them develop important life skills and to take part in sport, recreation and leisure events or activities that are of interest to the child.

LYCP Together Groups

Together Groups link small groups of children or young people with disabilities, supported by volunteers and sometimes peer volunteers, to bring them together to learn and strengthen social skills, build confidence and to support participation in community activities and events.



Vietnamese Community Programs

Programs specifically for Vietnamese children and their families who have a child with a disability. These programs are run by Vietnamese workers and include a social events and family outing program, MyTime Peer support groups and play groups, as well as a monthly Vietnamese friendship group.

Social Events Program/Family Fun Days

Children and families accessing our programs and also waiting for access are invited to family fun days and regional social events held each term. This program brings together families, children, staff and volunteers to facilitate social connections between people and enhance community participation.



Who we are

Extended Families Australia is a not-for-profit community organisation that provides support, respite, significant social relationships and community participation for children with disabilities and their families in Melbourne and the Mornington Peninsula.

We facilitate positive connections between people within a community to provide support and seek to widen social networks, empower individuals, promote inclusion and strengthen the bonds people have within their local area.

What we do

Children and families who are supported by Extended Families have access to a number of flexible support options founded upon volunteering models, including individualised volunteer matching for social, recreational and respite support, supported play groups, friendship groups and social events.

How we do it

Extended Families connects volunteers and children with disabilities and their families through friendship, fun and flexibility. We work with each child and family to support them to reach their goals and do the things they want to do. The individual support needs and interests of each child and family are carefully matched with the interests, skills and availability of a volunteer in order to create the best opportunity for a relationship to develop and for goals to be achieved.

Our volunteers assist children to participate in a range of recreation, leisure, sporting or cultural activities in the community that reflects their interests and preferences.
